AMPUTATION DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS

Medications:

- Take pain medication as directed.
- Do not drink beer, wine, or hard liquor or take recreational drugs while on pain medication.
- Take a gentle laxative such as Senekot S daily as directed if constipation becomes a problem.

Activity:

- No lifting over 10 pounds. A full gallon of milk weighs 8.6 pounds.
- Out of bed and up to a chair for meals.
- No driving until cleared to do so by your surgeon. Modifications may be required to return to driving. You are

at an increased risk of falling. Please use a walking aide and/or wheelchair as directed by physical therapy. Diet: •

Resume the diet you were on before surgery. Eat fruits, vegetables, and bran products to avoid constipation.

Wound Care:

• Keep your wound clean and dry. Change the dressing daily. Inspect your skin daily for redness and heat. Notify your home health nurse or physician if necessary.

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- Staples or sutures will be removed at the follow-up visit with your surgeon.
- Wear the knee immobilizer or post-operative rigid dressing, if provided, except when

bathing. • If you fall on your stump call your surgeon's office. You may need an urgent examination.

Bathing:

- You may shower but no tub baths, hot tubs, or whirlpools until approved by your surgeon.
- Gently pat your wounds dry.

Call Dr. Nasir Khan if any of the following conditions develop after discharge:

- Pain not controlled by the medication prescribed.
- Signs and symptoms of infection: shaking chills, redness, swelling, drainage from your wound, increased pain or a fever above 101 F (38.3C).
- If you had a catheter in your bladder, and you have signs and symptoms of urinary tract infection: fever, cloudy or foul-smelling urine, difficulty urinating, or burning with urination.

If unable to reach your doctor, go to the nearest emergency room.

Call your surgeon's office within 24 hours for a follow-up visit if it was not scheduled prior to discharge. *I* have read and understood these instructions.
